ECOMUN, Cooperative Ecosystem for Peace Building

The National Federation of Social Economies of the Common - ECOMUN, is an entity designated for the Collective Economic and Social Reincorporation in the Final Peace Agreement for the End of the Conflict and the Construction of a Stable and Lasting Peace, signed between the National Government of Colombia and the FARC-EP in November 2016 and elevated to the status of constitutional law. Formally created by Decree Law 899 of 2017, it is a second-tier Solidarity Organization that brings together 144 associative groups of peace signatories in 27 departments of the country, consolidating a model of Social and Solidarity Economies from the regions in permanent articulation.

The overall objective of organizing, building, and consolidating a second-tier federation like ECOMUN is to contribute to improving the well-being and quality of life of people in the process of reincorporation and the surrounding communities. It aims to become a national and international reference for social, solidarity, popular, and community economies and a successful experience in reincorporation processes.

As a second-tier organization, Ecomun has the responsibility of fostering the development of seven productive lines (livestock, coffee, fish farming, fruits and vegetables, clothing manufacturing, beekeeping, and services). It promotes organizational strengthening, productive, accounting, and legal technical assistance, and linkage through resource management, marketing, and the integration and planning of the economic activities of its members.

Therefore, a strategic task proposed by ECOMUN is the articulation between productive planning, available financing schemes, and the productive/monetary sustainability of the community and economic initiatives of the reincorporation process that exist in different parts of Colombia's geography.

The ECOMUN Federation of Federations will be responsible for:

Productive planning according to the needs and demands of the solidarity economy and the market, and the possibilities of the regional and sectoral organizations and the grassroots associative groups.

Coordinating technical assistance through its CEGES (Management and Services Center).

National and international marketing.

Resource management for the grassroots associative groups and the regional and sectoral organizations.

Representation before national public entities.

Implementation, monitoring, and management of the ECOMUN Financial Instrument (Revolving funds, guarantee funds, investment funds, and credit funds).

Promotion and development of the ECOMUN COOPERATIVE ECOSYSTEM.

Relationship-building with other organizations in the solidarity sector.

Our fattening model integrates livestock reconversion processes and animal welfare, backed by 21 cattle cooperatives with available inventory for the sale of live cattle on the Atlantic Coast, the central region, the east, the southwest of the country, and internationally. We maximize yield through the implementation of silvopastoral systems and regenerative livestock farming.
